

Dear Residents,

We are following up on our previous communication regarding the District's limited nonpotable irrigation water supply.

Water consumption continues to substantially exceed the District's conservation target of approximately 1.3 million gallons per day. Recent average usage has been approximately 1.90 million gallons per day on Tuesdays and Saturdays and 1.61 million gallons per day on Wednesdays and Sundays. On August 25 alone, the system used 2,151,392 gallons.

The District was fortunate to secure an additional 120 acre-feet of rental water, which has allowed the irrigation season to continue substantially longer than originally projected. However, August 29 was the final day of the 2026 Reservoir Delivery Season, as determined by the ditch board, not the District. No additional reservoir deliveries will be available this year.

Based on the remaining water supply and current projections, the nonpotable irrigation system is scheduled to operate through September 23 and shut down on September 24, 2026.

Residents must continue to follow the current two-day-per-week watering schedule and the Water Rules and Regulations requirement limiting sprinkler operation to 20 minutes at a time per zone.

If the 20-minute-per-zone limitation is not followed and water consumption remains excessive, the District may be required to shut down the nonpotable irrigation system before September 24.

Please continue to conserve water, repair leaks and broken sprinkler heads, prevent runoff, and use only the amount of water reasonably necessary for landscaping.

We appreciate everyone's cooperation as we work to extend the remaining water supply through the end of the irrigation season.
