The Chairman stated that proper publication was made to conduct a public hearing on the District's 2024 budget. The Chairman opened the public hearing on the District's proposed 2024 budget. There being no public present to comment on the District's budget, the public hearing was closed.

Thereupon, Director Russell introduced and moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

**RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF HUNTERS OVERLOOK METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 5**

A RESOLUTION SUMMARIZING REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR EACH FUND, ADOPTING A BUDGET, LEVYING GENERAL PROPERTY TAXES FOR THE YEAR 2024 TO HELP DEFRAY THE COSTS OF GOVERNMENT, AND APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY TO THE VARIOUS FUNDS IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH HEREIN FOR THE HUNTERS OVERLOOK METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 5, WELD COUNTY, COLORADO, FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR BEGINNING ON THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY, 2024, AND ENDING ON THE LAST DAY OF DECEMBER, 2024,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Hunters Overlook Metropolitan District No. 5 has authorized its consultants to prepare and submit a proposed budget to said governing body no later than October 15, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been submitted to the Board of Directors of the District for its consideration; and

WHEREAS, upon due and proper notice, published on October 11, 2023 in the Greeley Tribune, a newspaper having general circulation within the boundaries of the District, pursuant to statute, said proposed budget was available for inspection by the public at a designated public office, a public hearing was held on October 25, 2023 and interested electors were given the opportunity to file or register any objections to said proposed budget; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE HUNTERS OVERLOOK METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 5 OF WELD COUNTY, COLORADO:

Section 1. 2024 Budget Revenues. That the estimated revenues for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.

Section 2. 2024 Budget Expenditures. That the estimated expenditures for each fund as more specifically set out in the budget attached hereto are accepted and approved.

Section 3. Adoption of Budget for 2024. That the budget as submitted, and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference, and if amended, then as amended, is hereby approved and adopted by the Board of Directors as the true and accurate budget of the Hunters Overlook Metropolitan District No. 5 for calendar year 2024.

Section 4. 2024 Levy of General Property Taxes. That the foregoing budget indicated that the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for the General Fund for operating expenses is \$133,840 and the amount necessary to balance the budget for the Debt Service Fund for retirement of debt, bonds and interest thereon is \$669,210 that the 2023 valuation for assessment, as certified by the Weld County Assessor, is \$10,572,710.

A. Levy for General Fund. That for the purposes of meeting all general operating expense of the District during the 2024 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 12.659 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2023.

B. Levy for Debt Service Fund. That for the purposes of meeting all debt service expenses of the District during the 2024 budget year, there is hereby levied a tax of 63.296 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation of assessment of all taxable property within the District for the year 2023.

Section 5. Property Tax and Fiscal Year Spending Limits. That, being fully informed, the Board finds that the foregoing budget and mill levies do not result in a violation of any applicable property tax or fiscal year spending limitation.


Section 6. Certification. The District's manager is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners the mill levies for the District hereinabove determined and set. That said certification shall be in substantially the following form:

Section 7. Appropriations. That the amounts set forth as expenditures and balances remaining, as specifically allocated in the budget attached hereto, are hereby appropriated from the revenue of each fund, to each fund, for the purposes stated and no other.

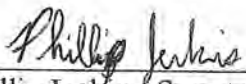

HUNTERS OVERLOOK METROPOLITAN DISTRICT NO. 5 2024 BUDGET MESSAGE

The Hunters Overlook Metropolitan District No. 5 (the District) is a quasi-municipal political subdivision of the State of Colorado. It was organized to provide for the acquisition, construction and completion of certain infrastructure improvements within the boundaries of the District. The District is governed by a five-member Board.

Basis of Accounting

The District prepares its budget on the modified accrual basis of accounting and uses funds to budget and report on its financial position.

Revenues

Taxes

The District imposes a mill levy of 75.955 mills. Of the 75.955 mills, 63.296 mills are pledged to District's Series 2019 bond issues. The remaining 12.659 mills will be used for administrative and operation costs, through a transfer to the Hunters Overlook District No. 1.

Specific ownership taxes are set by the State and collected by the County Clerk, primarily on vehicle licensing within the County as a whole. The specific ownership taxes are allocated by the County Treasurer to all taxing entities within the County, including the District.

Funds

General Fund

The General Fund transfers its net operations revenue to the Hunters Overlook Metropolitan District No. 1 which accounts for the administrative and operation costs of the Districts. The District has no employees and contracts with consultants to provide monthly services required to operate the District. The District has no operating or capital lease agreements.

Debt Service Fund

The Debt Service Fund is used to account for the District's two bond issues. The bonds will be repaid through property taxes and specific ownership taxes received from Hunters Overlook Metropolitan Districts No. 2, No. 3, No. 4 and No. 6, along with No. 5.

Emergency Reserve

At the end of each year the District reserves that portion of the fund balance necessary to comply with the TABOR Amendment in the Hunters Overlook Metropolitan District No. 1.
